


Moving Forward

In looking back at 2023, it was a positive year for the Foundation. Through the generosity and support of YOU, our donors and sponsors, the Foundation's two major fundraising events, the Annual Golf Tournament and Annual Appeal raised \$90,900, a 5.5% increase over 2022. With these funds and donations from the Home for Homeless Women, we were able to continue to support the Residence Assistance Program in the amount of \$800,000. Additionally, the Foundation supported the Memory Makers program at both the New York and Pennsylvania Campus's dementia units and various other small projects that would not otherwise be possible.

In looking to the future for the Foundation we are excited to announce the hiring of a VP of Development, Catherine Young who joined the Homes in September. 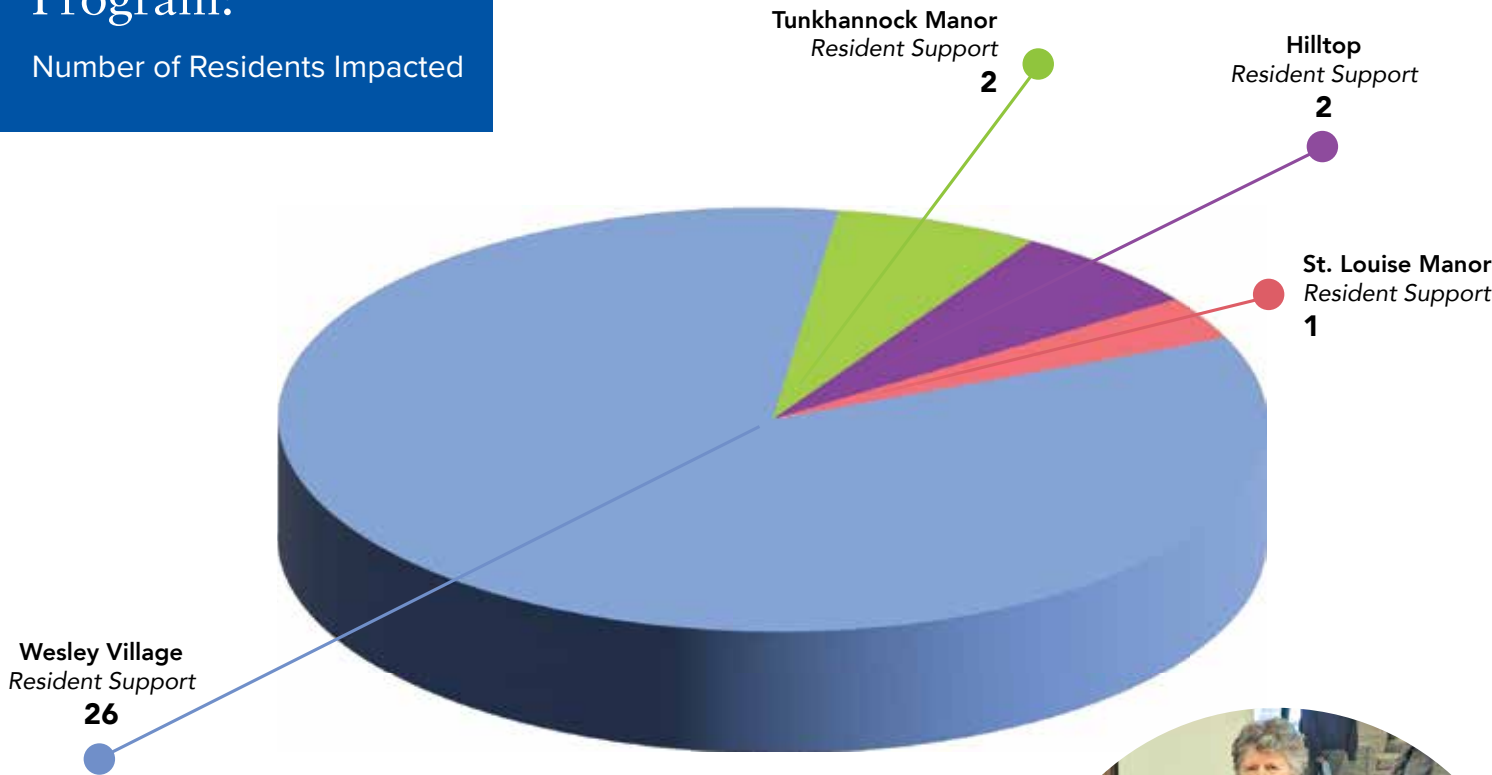
The Impact of the Resident Support Program and Charity Care
