At United Methodist Homes, our mission is to provide a wide range of senior living services with exceptional care and compassion. In order to do that, we are continually striving to maintain our high quality and seek partnerships that will benefit our residents.

Accomplishments

- JGJ maintains a 5-star rating; JGJ achieved "Best" Nursing Homes status by US News & World Report.
- Faye Clark completed her certification for CDP (Certified Dementia Practitioners).
- Kathy Micha completed her certification for Activity Consultant and Montessori Practitioner.
- The Montessori Program at ECM continues to flourish.
- Joined an alliance group and lobbied for NYS advocacy efforts to help promote and address the significant underfunding of the NYS Medicaid program for our seniors who require nursing home care.
- Successfully implemented improvements to the electronic learning management system making it more user-friendly and flexible for employee scheduling.
- Improved staffing and successfully transitioned staff to our Elizabeth Church Campus, which enabled us to reopen unit two for admissions, including short-term rehab.
- Wesley Village achieved SILVER status for "Best Personal Care & Retirement" and "Best Nursing Home".
- Launched Independent Living at Tunkhannock Campus.
- In preparation for NY Campuses transformation efforts toward operational improvement, Ron Patti, former Executive Director of the Hilltop Campus was promoted to Chief Operating Officer. Vicky Morabito was appointed the sole NY Executive Director and transitioned to the Hilltop Campus with oversight over all of NY operations. Kate Conant was promoted to Senior Administrator and transitioned to Elizabeth Church Manor on the Elizabeth Church Campus.

Elder Engagement Award

Katherine Micha, Activities Director at United Methodist Homes, Elizabeth Church Manor Campus, won the First Annual Elder Engagement Award presented by Brush Development for her incorporation of the Montessori Approach into their dementia care. Brush Development is the only approved Association Montessori Internationale training center for Montessori for Aging and Dementia in the United States. The environment that Kathy and her team have created and continue to expand upon has improved resident quality of life and engagement in their community. The staff has observed an overall decrease in negative behaviors and improved mood since the implementation of this program. They have noted improved resident morale, which has evolved into more opportunities to engage in meaningful activities that are familiar or comfortable activities from a resident's past. The incorporation of Montessori elements into the unit was made possible by significant funding from the UMH Foundation through the support of our generous donors.

Inaugural Music Festival: A Tribute Event



The generosity of one family made possible a day of celebration for the life of former resident Doris Brownlow. United Methodist Homes had the pleasure of serving Doris throughout the care continuum for more than 13 years. In 2009, Doris moved to the Hilltop Campus as an Independent Living resident before transitioning to Assisted

Living in 2018. She later moved to the skilled nursing center, where she passed away in April 2022.

Doris's family and daughter Linda Greensfelder shared that they were inspired to do something to honor their mother while also showing their appreciation for the staff for all they did for their mom over the years. Especially throughout the difficult times brought on by the pandemic, where visitor restrictions meant they relied heavily on staff assistance to stay connected with their mom. Linda shared, "During the pandemic, we did several small things, primarily food-related, to thank the staff for their incredible care and dedication, but what we offered was in no way commensurate with their contributions."

After their mother died, Linda, along with her brothers, David and John, talked about their wish to create a memorial to their mom that would be a fitting event to honor her and something the staff could enjoy. "Mom wasn't a bench or garden person, and while she was an artist and an art lover, we weren't sure art would provide the kind of active enjoyment she would have preferred. From our perspective, the obvious choice was a music festival in Mom's honor. Mom loved music, and she loved to share it with others. Her mother was a piano teacher, so family gatherings always included singing and harmonizing, with or without a piano.

She played piano by ear, had a grand piano in her apartment, and sang in several church choirs over the years. Mom never missed Rick Pedro when he came to play at the campus! And she and dad loved to dance, particularly to the Bennie Goodman era swing music." Faye Clark, Hilltop Campus Life Coordinator, the dedicated Fall Fest Committee, and all of the employees who planned and implemented the event did a great job coordinating and lining up the entire day with talented musicians, games, activities, and food.

UMH is grateful for the Brownlow family's generous donation, which made for a wonderful tribute event on the campus in which staff, residents, and visitors enjoyed in Doris' honor. The family plans to contribute to the UMH Foundation annually in order to create this experience. "We are confident this is the kind of memorial Mom would have loved, and we are so pleased to be able to give back to the community in this way."

The Impact of the Resident Support Program

The Resident Support Program is one of the most impactful programs in the lives of our residents. This benevolent program ensures that our residents who reside in our lower levels of care can receive the financial support they need to live in our communities once they have exhausted their personal resources. Moving to a senior living community can be stressful, and the worries associated with change can be overwhelming. A common concern among residents is what will happen to them if they outlive their resources. Having a program such as this to assist them in times of need is critical to overall well-being and quality of life. Through this program and with your continued support, we can provide peace of mind and alleviate some of the worries of tomorrow for our residents.

Winston Churchill once stated, "We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." Truly, giving brings a sense of purpose and reward for those that give while positively impacting the recipient's life. In 2022, our Resident Support Program positively impacted the lives of 30 residents in our communities, funding \$782,756.44 toward the cost of living. A resident who is a recipient of the support program stated, "I am very thankful for the support of United Methodist Homes. They have given me the opportunity to continue to call Tunkhannock Manor my Home. I am able to continue being with my friends and the wonderful staff".

This program will continue to be one of our major funding initiatives, and our 2023 Annual Golf Tournament proceeds will be allocated to this program once again.

Donor Spotlights

Gary & Wilma Gardner - Employee, Legacy Society Members

The Gardner's' relationship with United Methodist Homes goes back decades – long before Gary joined the staff in 1999. Wilma's great-aunt Mary was a long-term resident at Partridge-Tippett in the 1980s. She was the first family member to be cared for on the Wesley Village campus. Wilma's aunt Shirley also received care, but then three of the Gardner's' four parents received Wesley's comprehensive services.

Gary's mom, Ruth, moved to Brooks Estates a decade after her husband, Edward, passed away. The family home became too much and too far away for comfort and safety. Wilma's parents moved there two years later after her father, Carl Hurst, was diagnosed with Alzheimer's, and her mom, Wilma, needed a smaller house and closer family support to care for him at home. Over time, Carl would become a resident in the Serenity Unit, and skilled nursing would become necessary for Wilma due to a chronic illness. Carl passed away in 2006, and Wilma in 2014. Ruth also progressed through Wesley's continuum of care until she became a Partridge-Tippett resident until her death last year at 97.

"It was so difficult when our parents encountered health issues that eventually meant that being at home was no longer an option," says Wilma. "But it was reassuring to know they were receiving excellent, compassionate care at Wesley Village. It gave us peace of mind during some very difficult times." Gary says it was heart-warming to see the relationships their parents had with many staff members and the personal attention they received. "Individual staff took the time to get to know our parents and obviously cared about them," he says. "They were treated like family."

Gary and Wilma contribute to United Methodist Homes in memory of all four parents and to help UMH continue the Mission they personally experienced. "We owe so much to our parents," says Gary. "They made us the people we are today, and supporting the UMH mission is a fitting way to honor them."




Organization Financial Report



Stewardship Responsibility Note

Our goal as a nonprofit organization is to have the resources available to fund the following mission needs: charitable services, periodic operational shortfalls, investment in property and equipment, program enhancements, and future growth. Your contributions are essential to help provide these services.

Charity Care

The generosity of others has enabled the Foundation to quietly distribute funds through the program, filling the gap for those that have exhausted their financial means. United Methodist Homes maintains records to identify and monitor the level of charity care it provides. UMH considers care provided to residents that are part of its Resident Assistance Program to be charity care; not care provided to Medical Assistance beneficiaries or residents that are eligible for Supplemental Security Income (SSI). In 2022, UMH's estimated costs of charity care services were approximately \$969,000. The Foundation received \$79,269 in contributions restricted for charity care and \$1,209,975 of income distributions from perpetual trusts restricted for charity care.


